General Information

Uniform

Students are asked to arrive on the first day of school in a school team must wear Bayview Glen athletic clothing when participating. All uniform items should be labelled with the student's name so that misplaced pieces may be returned to their owners. Kilt hems should be no shorter than 3" above the knee. Please see the Uniform Checklists at the end of this booklet for further information.

Immunization Records

Toronto Public Health reviews all student immunization records annually. It is important, therefore, that parents provide proof of up-to-date immunizations including each vaccine and the date given (year, month and day). If you have already submitted your child's immunization records, it is not necessary to submit them again. However, if you have never submitted an immunization record or if you have new information, please submit a photocopy to the Admissions Office who will forward it to Toronto Public Health.

Specific questions concerning up-to-date immunization records or exemptions due to medical reasons, or reasons of religion or conscience should be directed to the Immunization Hotline at 416.392.1250.

Class Parents and Grade Representatives

Class Parents (BG2 to Grade 5) and Grade Representatives uniform. All students taking Physical Education or representing (Grades 6 to 12) perform an important role within the school community and enjoy working closely with the teachers and parents. Ideally, two volunteers are chosen to represent each class in the Preschool and Lower School, and in each grade in the Prep School and Upper School. Responsibilities include sending communications from the school and Parent Association, being a resource for new parents, and organizing social events for parents (or families) in each grade or class. If you would like to volunteer as a Class Parent in the Preschool or Lower School, please let your child's Homeroom Teacher know. If you would like to be a Grade Representative in the Prep School or Upper School, please contact Jennifer Clarkin for Prep School at jclarkin@bayviewglen.ca or Debbie Rennicks for Upper School at drennicks@bayviewglen.ca. Please understand that, unfortunately, it is not always possible to assign positions to all those who offer to volunteer.

Bussing

You will be contacted via email before school starts with the approximate pick up and/or drop off times. Bussing is charged on a per seat basis with the daily cost of two-way bussing being \$27.50 and one-way bussing being \$18.75.

Students requiring temporary bussing are asked to make a written request at least one week in advance to ensure that bussing can be properly organized. Permission will be granted so long as your address falls within the existing bus routes. Written requests may be forwarded to Diane Weston at dweston@bayviewglen.ca.

Pick Up and Drop Off: Parent Bench

Please see individual School information with regard to Parent Bench updates.

- We ask that you, as parents, be cognizant of all students during these very busy times of the day. You should also be aware of the flow of traffic behind your vehicle and stop as far up the line as possible.
- It is imperative that drivers slow down when entering the vicinity of the school, and that they are highly aware of students as they step out of cars in the morning and walk towards them in the afternoon.
- Please ensure your car is in park with your handbrake on while you are in the Parent Bench line. However, should you need to vacate your car during Parent Bench, please ensure your car is turned off. Please note parents should only vacate their car to help with car seats for younger students. We ask all other parents to kindly remain in the vehicle.
- We have parents and guests who require designated accessible parking, and would appreciate if this was left clear for them.
- · Please refrain from using our neighbours' driveways as they are justifiably concerned about us doing so.
- · Please do not make left turns into or out of the pick up zone.
- Upper School students without siblings in other divisions should be dropped off and picked up at the Turf parking lot and enter and leave the school via their assigned doors.
- Please note that there is no student parking available on campus. Students who drive to school should make arrangements to park at one of the many pay lots near the school.

Mental Health and Wellness

Mental Health and Wellness for our students is an important element of Bayview Glen's Whole Child philosophy and will continue to be an important focus for us during the 2022-2023 school year.

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought many changes to the daily lives of our students and families and with this comes uncertainty, altered daily routines, social isolation and a whole myriad of thoughts and feelings.

To support our students as we transition to a regular school routine and throughout the upcoming school year, Bayview Glen will continue to offer various mental health and wellness support programmes. We have also hired a Director of Student Wellness to assist us and provide guidance and direction.

We will continue to provide professional mental health resources and support for the ongoing needs of staff and students in all divisions through qualified Mental Health experts. Further details about this support will be forthcoming.

Also, the Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) programme titled, 'Second Step' will continue to be implemented in the Lower and Prep Schools to help promote dialogue and support positive mental health. This JK to Grade 8 year-long programme will be facilitated by the Homeroom Teachers through weekly conversations and curriculum studies.

All of our faculty and staff were certified in Mental Health First Aid through the Mental Health Association of Canada in 2019 which has provided them with the tools to recognize the need for support.

Gryphons Athletics

Welcome back! We are very proud of our Gryphons Athletics Programme, and we encourage your child to consider joining a team this year. Each student can participate on one team per term.

We welcome any students in Grades 3-12 to participate in Gryphons Athletics. The teams are grouped according to age and Grade, and we have many age groups for each sport. There are three sports seasons. The fall season runs from September to the end of October/beginning of November. The winter term runs from the end of October/beginning of November to the end of February/beginning of March. The spring term runs from the end of March to the end of May/beginning of June. It is compulsory for students in Grades 3 to 5 to participate in at least one team per year. It is highly recommended that students in Grades 6-12 participate in at least one sport per year. Registration for each sports season's tryouts will take place online in the athletics section of the Bayview Glen website and will open approximately one month prior to the first tryouts. All registrations must be completed prior to the first tryout. For afternoon practices, the students will be picked up and taken directly to their practice location by their teachers/coaches. At the end of practice, parents are asked to pick up their children at the practice location. Students who are registered for Study Hall/Extended Day Programme will be taken directly to the programme after practices and games. Bus students will not be able to ride the bus on practice days, and parents should notify the transportation department/bus driver of these days in advance.

For morning practices, students should be dropped off directly at the practice site. Parents, please ensure that you have connected with your child's coach before leaving your child at the site. Students should come to practice in their physical education clothes and appropriate footwear (cleats and shin pads for soccer (not needed for tryouts), indoor running shoes for basketball and volleyball), and Bayview Glen outer wear in case of inclement weather (i.e., phys-ed sweatshirts, track pants, track jackets). Only Bayview Glen athletic clothing, including outerwear, is to be worn during practices and games. In addition, all students who participate on a team must have the Bayview Glen Track Suit (available at the Shop). Students should pack their school uniform in their bags and will be given time to change before class. For afternoon practices, students should pack their athletic gear in a bag, and will be given time to change before the practice.

Private Music Lessons

The Private Music Lessons Programme at Bayview Glen is provided as a convenient service to parents and students to allow for private music instruction during after-school hours.

The Private Music Lessons Programme is available to students in Grades 1 to 12 whose musical knowledge is at the beginner or advanced level. Each week, students enrolled will receive a private half-hour lesson on the instrument of their choice. All instructors are highly qualified musicians from the community and will each determine, through consultation with parents, the needs and goals for each child. Royal Conservatory of Music examination preparation is also an available option. This programme is based on the full year and does not run on a term-by-term basis. Please visit the website for the most current information at bayviewglen.ca/private-musiclessons.

Students may choose instruction in a wide selection of instruments:

Lower School: Piano, Voice, Guitar/Ukulele, Violin, Theory Prep School and Upper School: Piano, Voice, Guitar/Ukulele, Woodwinds, Brass, Violin, Percussion, Theory

Students will be responsible for providing their own instruments and for the purchase of music books and sheet music that may be assigned by the instructor. It is also recommended that piano students have a piano or full-sized keyboard at home for practice. Students will be assigned a half-hour time outside of the regular school day.

Instructions

If your child is an existing student of the Lessons Programme, the following steps are required:

- Complete the online registration form and \$80 payment at bayviewglen.ca/private-music-lessons between Monday, August 22 and Wednesday, August 31 for priority scheduling.
- Once submitted, the Private Instructor will reach out shortly after.

If your child is a new student to the Lessons Programme, the following steps are required:

- Complete the online registration form and \$80 payment at bayviewglen.ca/private-music-lessons on or after Thursday, September 1.
- Wait to be contacted by the Co-ordinator for further information.

Enrolled Students

Schedules and instructors will be assigned to each student in early September once a student is officially registered. Fees are \$37.50 per 30 minute lesson and this amount is payable directly to the instructor. A handbook of procedures, including missed lessons, holidays, etc., will be provided at the start of lessons. Lessons begin in mid-to-late September, once you are contacted by the assigned Private Instructor.

First Day: What to Bring

Please make sure ALL items are clearly labelled with your child(ren)'s name and come in a knapsack that zips shut.

- Water bottle
- Sunscreen
- Hat for outdoors
- Two full changes of clothing
- One extra pair of shoes all children will need indoor shoes for the classroom along with a pair of shoes for outdoor activities (no open toe shoes or crocks like sandals)
- Diapers, wipes and cream
- ALL signed forms

Daily Communication

- · Please communicate with the staff using email or Edsby. Thi is the best form of communication and allows us all to be respectful of each other's time.
- During the week prior to classes beginning, Homeroom Teachers will communicate a welcome message to all parents to introduce themselves and review relevant information. Please ensure that the Admissions Department has your most up-to-date contact information.

Our Preschool programme is operational for early morning care beginning at 7:30 a.m. We ask that all students are in programme by 9:00 a.m. On those days that you may be running late or have appointments, please notify your Homeroom Teacher through Edsby and when you arrive to campus sign in through our reception for your child/children to be marked present on our safe arrival attendance.

For those students who are with us for a Half Day Programme, dismissal will be at 12:00 p.m. We ask that you check in at our reception upon arrival. Your child/children will only be permitted to leave with those noted on your registration papers and will be asked for photo identification upon arrival.

Full Day Dismissal will begin at 2:45 p.m. through our Parent Bench until 4:00 p.m. Please have your Parent Bench Tag visible during this time. If you do not have a colour-coded Parent Bench tag, please contact Ms. Cornelia Stancescu at cstancescu@bayviewglen.ca to receive a Parent Bench tag.

If your child/children are registered for **Extended Day**

4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. or 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

You will be provided an Extended Day Programme card that you are required to bring to pick up your child/children. You will be required to sign in at our reception by showing your Extended Day Programme Card and photo identification. A reminder that your child/children will only be dismissed to those individuals who are listed on your registration papers as authorized to do so. If arrangements are made for an alternative pick up, you must inform the school in writing prior to picking up your child/children.

Parent Bench

For our BG families with children who are transitioning to Preschool for the first time, parking is available at our Moatfield Campus during the first two weeks of school. You may enter into the school through our reception entrance, and we will have a member of faculty meet you there to help with your arrival. As of September 19, 2022, we ask that you please begin using our Parent Bench for arrival between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and for dismissal beginning at 2:45 p.m. If you need more time before becoming comfortable utilizing our Parent Bench, please reach out to myself and I am happy to work with you and your family to create a safe arrival plan.

Thank you for your co-operation using our Parent Bench, this is the most efficient and safest approach during the busy times of arrival and dismissal. Parent Bench Policies can be found within our Preschool Parent Handbook. We ask you all to review these important policies before using Parent Bench.

Holiday Programme

Bayview Glen's Holiday Programme is available to our Preschool students who have pre-registered throughout the year, on scheduled school breaks:

- Fall Midterm Break Friday, November 11 and Monday, November 14
- Winter Midterm Break Friday, February 17
- March Break Friday, March 10 to Friday, March 24
- Monday, June 19 to Friday, June 23

Our Holiday Programme runs from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and our Holiday Programme Staffing provide fun, engaging experiences for our students during these academic school breaks. More information will be provided prior to registering for our Fall Midterm Break Holiday Programme from our Holiday Programme Co-ordinator.

Professional Development Days (PD Days)

Two Professional Development Days are noted on our calendar: Friday, October 7 and Friday, May 19.

During these two days our faculty will embark on reflective practices and engage in ongoing professional learning that will help continue to serve our community by providing an excellent Preschool programme.

Sick Policy and Daily Screening for Symptoms of Illness Our Pandemic Planning has changed throughout the course of the last two years; however, our goal is still to continue to ensure that the well-being of all our Bayview Glen community is upheld. This brings us to our Sick Policy outlined in our Preschool Parent Handbook. We ask that if your child/children may be unwell and cannot participate fully in our engaging and active Preschool programme that they remain at home. Our Sick Policy provides details on what to do if your child/children have a fever, communicable disease, gastrointestinal upset or a common cold.

Daily Screening for COVID-19 symptoms and required isolation is still currently mandatory from Toronto Public Health and the Minister of Health. We ask that you complete your Daily Screening using the Ontario COVID-19 School Screening Tool found here:

Message from the Head of Lower School and Preschool

Dear Lower School Families.

Wherever this finds you, I hope you are well and that you and your family are enjoying the joys of summer. To our new families, welcome to the Lower School and I look forward to getting to know you as your children begin in September on campus.

All children and families will be welcomed into the school on Friday, September 2 for an optional orientation. Our first day of school will be on Tuesday, September 6. This will be a full day of school for all students and will be the start of a school year that incorporates all the best practices of a 'Whole Child' education which include outdoor learning, field trips, sports teams (Grades 3 to 5), and on-campus clubs.

Speaking of on-campus, we look forward to having all of our students take part in learning on the Lower School campus. We have retired online learning and it will not be an option this upcoming school year. If students cannot attend school due to illness or protocols, they will be able to access work via their classes Microsoft Teams OneNote notebook.

We are also going back to the pre-pandemic cohorting of playgrounds, use of the cafeteria and uniform practices. On gym days, students can wear their gym clothes, and on non-gym days they are expected to be in full dress even if they have a sports practice or a game. Students who have a sports practise or a game will be given time to change in the school and should pack their necessary Bayview Glen athletic clothing. Please look at the section of this mailing dedicated to uniforms for any questions you may have about the proper attire.

Although we are reintroducing many pre-pandemic practices, COVID-19 is not going away, and as we continue to adapt, we will remain a mask-friendly school and all students are welcome to wear masks on campus. We also continue to work and follow the Ontario Government and Toronto Public Health Guidelines when it comes to COVID-19. As we come closer to the school year, the screening guidelines that the school will use in September will be shared.

I am excited to help Bayview Glen continue to deliver an academic programme that is second to none. In doing so, we continue to ensure our educators are the most qualified. To help facilitate continuous professional learning, the school is introducing two professional learning days within the school year on top of our August and June offerings. The Friday before Thanksgiving in October and the Friday before the Victoria Day Weekend in May will now be dedicated to staff professional development. As such, the school will be closed on those days and there will be no holiday programme as all educators will be dedicating that time to ensuring excellence in education.

In the sections on the following page, you will find other pertinent information for the start of the school year. Until we see each other in September, I hope you have a great rest of the summer and know that the Lower School staff are dedicated to providing a safe and nurturing environment for your children to grow and excel in the upcoming school year.

Attendance and Commitment to Screening

- Parents are required to screen their children prior to coming to school. While this is not logged in our system, we ask that families sustain the routine of monitoring their children carefully for any illness every day.
- We ask that parents inform the school of any absences through Edsby.
- Should students not be able to attend classes on campus, they can access work via Edsby and OneNote.
- If a student becomes ill during the day, parents will be called to pick up their child.

Arrivals

School starts at 8:30 a.m. for all JK to Grade 5 students. There will be Early Parent Bench and morning programme available for all students. This will take place from 7:30 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. for Grade 4 and 5 students and 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. for all JK to Grade 3 students.

We ask that all JK to Grade 5 Lower School students use the Parent Bench drop-off programme. If parents wish to walk their child(ren) to parent bench from a parking lot, they may also do so.

Dismissal

Early Afternoon Parent Bench will begin again at 2:45 p.m. this year. It will run for 45 minutes. During this time, all students from BG2 to Grade 2 are encouraged to be picked up. For students who are of that age but have an older sibling (Grade 3 and up) they will wait until the Late Parent Bench dismissal time which will start at 3:30 p.m.

As stated, Late Parent Bench will begin each day at 3:30 p.m. All Grade 4 and 5 students without younger siblings, will be picked up at the 85 Moatfield Campus across the street from the Lower School. Any families that have siblings with at least one child in Grade 3 or younger, will have all their children picked up from the 3:30 p.m. Lower School Parent Bench.

We will also continue to offer After School programming from 4:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. If you wish to partake in the After School programme, please connect with Admissions to ensure you are enrolled.

Classroom Preparedness

- Teachers will provide all necessary materials for learning on the first days.
- Students are welcome to bring in a pencil case if they wish; however, it is not necessary for the start of the school year.

Message from the Head of Prep School

Dear Prep School Families,

Our first day of school is Tuesday, September 6. This is a full day for all students, and we will begin in Homerooms. At the end of the week prior to classes commencing, Homeroom Teachers will be in touch with parents to introduce themselves and review pertinent information. Please ensure that the Admissions Department has your most up-to-date contact information and that you are logged in to Edsby so that this correspondence can occur.

Students will be returning to wearing the uniform as it was prior to the pandemic. We see wearing the school uniform as a reflection of school pride and expect our students to commit to this throughout the school year. Please ensure that your child has all the required uniform pieces prior to arriving in September. Also, specifically note, that all students are to wear black, polishable dress shoes with a flat heel. Please do not purchase black running shoes. Attendance and Commitment to Screening

- Parents are required to screen their children prior to coming to school. While this is not logged in our system, we ask that families sustain the routine of monitoring their children carefully for any illness every day.
- We ask that parents inform the school of any absences and late arrivals through Edsby.
- Should students not be able to attend classes on campus, they can access work via Edsby and OneNote.
- In the event that a student becomes ill during the day, parents will be called to pick up their child.

Arrival and Departure

- Classes begin at 8:30 a.m. each morning.
- Students are encouraged not to arrive before 8:00 a.m. unless participating in a co-curricular activity or prior arrangements have been made with faculty members.
- Students who must arrive early may sit in the Daunt Dining Hall. Tablets and cellphones are not allowed at this time.
- Evening Parent Bench begins at 3:25 p.m. and ends at 4:00 p.m.
- If your child is the sibling of an Upper School student and you wish to collect both children at the Turf parking lot, please let us know (in the link that will be provided).
- Prep School students who need to meet Lower School siblings will meet designated staff after they are dismissed from classes and will be walked over to an outside designated area. Please let us know (in the link that will be provided).

Classroom Preparedness

- We ask that students ensure that their tablets are fully charged each day, and that they bring all their own supplies with them (pens, pencils, erasers, ruler, protractors, coloured pencils, calculators, etc.) in labelled pencil cases.
- Students should also bring their own labelled water bottle.

Uniforn

Orientation for New Students

Before Classes Start

Community Service Hours

Students entering their Grade 12 year need 40 hours of community service to earn their OSSD and a total of 50 to earn the Bayview Glen Diploma. All students in Grades 9, 10, and 11 will need a total of 60 hours to earn the Bayview Glen Diploma going forward. All students are encouraged to seek out options for community service that can be safely performed either remotely or in-person while observing the prevailing public health guidelines.

Any community service hours that have been accumulated over the course of the summer should be submitted to Ms. Sukaina Fatima in the Student Services office. Forms should be scanned and sent electronically to studentservices@bayviewglen.ca.

Course Changes

Any requests for course changes should be submitted electronically at the link provided in your course verification email.

Priority for course changes will be given to those students who have been informed of conflicts in their timetables. Please note that, as in all years, we cannot guarantee that all changes will be possible and students are expected to follow the timetables provided until their requested changes are confirmed.

Students who have taken a compulsory or prerequisite course in summer school will be required to provide a copy of the report card before a course change can be processed.

Daily Routine

Commitment to Screening

As we move back fully on campus, it still remains important that each student screens themselves each morning to ensure they are not sick when coming to school. If students feel even slightly ill, they should stay home. In the event that a child becomes ill during the day, parents will be called to pick up their child.

Mask wearing will continue to be optional and we will remain a mask-friendly environment.

Co-Curricular Activities

Arrival and Departure

- Students are encouraged not to arrive at school before 8:00 a.m. unless participating in an organized co-curricular activity or prior arrangements have been made to meet with a teacher. Students who must arrive before 8:00 a.m. will be asked to go to the Daunt Dining Hall.
- Students in Grades 9-11 will enter and leave the Upper School via the double doors at the top of the steel staircase to the south of the Moatfield Campus.
- Students in Grade 12 will enter and leave the Upper School via the door closest to the Turf Parking lot that leads directly to the Grade 12 Common Area.
- Students coming late to school should go directly to reception to sign in and receive a late slip. They should then proceed straight to class.

Dress

- When in person at the school, students are expected to be in proper daily uniform, including polishable black shoes with black soles.
- First dress should be worn **for the full day** on all assembly days and designated special occasions. On other days throughout the month of September, students may wear either the Bayview Glen golf shirt or white shirt or blouse.

Gym Uniform



General Notes About Uniforms:

- 1. All uniform items must fit properly and be in a good state of
- 2. For students choosing to wear the tunic or kilt: a) The tunic must be worn up to Grade 2 and may be worn up to Grade 3. The kilt may be worn beginning in Grade 3 and must be worn beginning in Grade 4.
- b) A tie is not required when wearing the tunic, but must be worn with the kilt.
- 3. Shirts and blouses with curved tails must be worn tucked in at all times. Shirts and blouses with straight, notched bottoms, such as golf shirts and 'French-cut' blouses, may be
- worn untucked. When worn with a tie, all buttons of the shirt or blouse will be fastened. Only the top button of the golf shirt will be left unfastened.
- 4. Trousers should be hemmed long enough to reach the top of the wearer's dress shoe when standing. Shorts, tunics, kilts, and skirts should be hemmed so as to hang no shorter than 7.5 cm (3") above the top of the wearer's knee. Waistbands will not be rolled.
- 5. A plain black leather or webbing belt, with a simple, unbranded metal buckle may be worn with the grey trousers or shorts in all orders of dress.
